"NAA-SAU: A NECESSARY SUPPLEMENT TO SAU'S SUSTAINABILITY" My tenure as president will come to an end, June 30, 2022. It has been, without question, a rewarding experience, complete with the requisite conditions of being in a leadership position—there are the pluses and minuses, the highs and the lows, the ups and the downs, and all of the adjectives and adverbs in between. As I reflect on my time as president, I am reminded of the question—"What is a necessary supplement?" From my window on the world, I see it as: That which is added to complete a state of being"—as the National Alumni Association to Saint Augustine's University is a substantial supplement of the University. Alumni support is necessary to sustain our alma mater, in addition to executive and scholastic leadership. We, the alumni ARE a necessary supplement.

A college or university cannot thrive and be recognized without the contributions from its Alumni. Let me count the ways: financial support, recruitment, mentoring and a visual demonstration of the legacy of the university. Future students, the academic community and others measure the success of a university by the products it produces, be it doctors, scientist, lawyers, teachers, judges, politicians, entertainers, or other recognizable vocations. A university is only as good as the graduates it produces, not only because of their individual accomplishments, but because the university can *lay claim* to the success of the individual. Another part of this narrative is the fact, that the more successful a university's graduates are, the more they can donate to the school or get others to donate. This fact needs to be kept in mind, as alumni of Saint Augustine's support the University's Leadership effort in reimaging the institution.

As we think about reimaging Saint Augustine's University, it should cover the full range of the institution's activities—including revisions to the degree/curriculum offerings; certificate programs; associate degrees; and the athletic program. All the previously mentioned elements of the University's programs are key to building a growing, sustainable, and prestigious institution called Saint Augustine's University. Another critical element is having a knowledgeable, dedicated, and stable cadre of professors, staff, and university leaders. Part of the legacy of "St. Aug" is the outstanding people who worked at our alma mater, either as a teacher of a particular subject or as support staff. All made sure that the students' educational needs were met. Certainly, many of us would have had our college/university life curtailed were it not for the resolute individuals who made "St. Aug" their vocation and avocation.

# Saint Augustine's University and the National Alumni Association Mentoring Program (SAU-NAA SMP)

The SAU *Mentoring Program* with the support of the NAA-SAU met in late January 2022, with approximately twenty-five alumni signing up to become Mentors. However, progress was stalled because of several challenges (e.g., background clearances, mentee assignments) and not everyone was assigned a Mentee. These issues are being reconciled and several Mentors and Mentees have begun to interact as they should under the guidelines for the program. We hope this effort will continue into the summer and the next academic year of the program. One of the objectives of the *Mentoring Program* is to help in the retention of Saint Augustine's students through long term student-mentor partnerships. We will continue to accept applications from alumni to become mentors and work with Saint Augustine's University Leadership to have a successful Mentoring Program.

**Recruitment** 

Recruitment efforts show great promise, with Dr. McPhail envisioning over two thousand students to be enrolled over the next two years. The NAA-SAU has been asked to help in this goal, not only in its normal recruitment activities, but by making a special effort to reach out to the two thousand or more students who have been accepted to attend Saint Augustine's but, who may be still undecided. We hope that with individual alumni contacting each of the accepted students we might be able to increase that number in the future.

NAA-SAU Chapters have begun reaching out to the students on the list, but we need more alumni to help. If you are aware of any students considering attending Saint Augustine's, make a special effort to reach out to these students and let them know about your alma mater or have them reach out to other alumni, who might be able to provide more information. Increasing enrollment is fundamental to reimaging Saint Augustine's and having money to do the things that are necessary for a new and unique institution. Increased enrollment will bring significant infrastructure challenges, which means raising money.

We can apply for grants and other foundation type assistance. We must work as a team to identify and pursue these resources.

#### **Fundraising**

Alumni level of participation is monitored by organizations like the UNCF, and we at Saint Augustine's fall somewhere between ten and eleven percent, not measured by what we donate, but by **how many**of us donate annually. If those of us who participate in giving can encourage one other alumnus to make a small donation, we can double our alumni participation rate, which is significant in soliciting corporate giving. Many of the UNCF schools are raising their alumni participation rate and we can, too.

NAA-SAU Chapters continue to fundraise and have continued with their donations to the school during the last year. The NAA-SAU has been limited in having fundraising events, but we look forward to getting back to near normal in the coming academic year. Alumni giving, with NAA-SAU leadership, had been increasing over the past few years, however, the Covid pandemic adversely impacted this trend, but we are back making strides in improving alumni giving. We are currently discussing our major fundraiser for Homecoming, 2022. We will keep alumni informed of the progress of planned activities. **Please continue your annual giving and commitments to SAU. Let set a goal of Alumni Giving at One Million Dollars for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.** 

Special thanks to all the alumni who participated in the *Home Depot Retool Your School* campaign that garnered over twenty thousand dollars for SAU to resurface the outdoor basketball court. This was truly a team effort and demonstrates what alumni can do when we get involved and support these fundraisers. Next year we will start early and compete for first place. 
## *The HBCU Experience: Saint Augustine's University Edition*Book Review
