NAA-SAU UPDATE

Membership

Your NAA-SAU membership has continued to grow over the last two years, with increases in all categories. The use of our new platform, Wild Apricot, to collect membership dues and donations, has improved the process for making payments to the NAA-SAU. Alumni will soon be able to purchase memorabilia using the Wild Apricot software, which allows the organization to record payments, issue receipts and track membership. Membership renewal and donations can be made online in real time. Donations to SAU

Donations to the University from your NAA-SAU will continue even in these difficult fundraising times with Covid-19. Our goal for academic year 2020-2021 is \$40K, down somewhat from last year, but we have already made a first installment during the 2020 Virtual Homecoming. Alumni and Chapter Giving had increased over the last few years until FY 2020, when several spring fundraising events were cancelled. Our signature Homecoming fundraiser, the King/Queen contest was also cancelled.

Total Alumni and Chapter Giving was: FY2016: \$174,315; FY 2017 \$361,295; FY2018: \$594,264; FY2019: \$376,574 and FY2020: \$310, 854, with a 4-year average of \$410,746. It is worth noting that we were on our way to a record year in FY2020, wherein our fundraiser for the dormitory repairs had netted over \$190K and with the spring events being sponsored by the Chapters, we could have matched our FY2018 amount.

Fundraising this academic year and the next will require new approaches as our leaders at the local, state, and federal levels work to get the Covid-19 pandemic under control.

2021 Planning: Fundraising, Philanthropy and Recruitment

Fundraising

We are currently investigating the possibility of planning a large fundraiser for Spring 2021. Several Alumni and friends of the university are reaching out to celebrities to put on a significant (5 Star Show) either on campus or off campus depending on the circumstances. We are considering a April/May time frame depending on what is happening with COVID-19 or we could schedule around our Summer Conference that is planned for Raleigh in June 2021. We are planning to begin the competition period for our 2021 Homecoming King/Queen fundraiser. Your input on how to proceed is appreciated.

Effective Wednesday, November 25, 2020, alumni will be able to purchase SAU garden flags and other alumni memorabilia to support our giving to our alma mater through this link. Order yours early for a nice Christmas gift.

Philanthropy

Several NAA-SAU members have volunteered to be part of the NAA-SAU *Philanthropy Network* (and we need more volunteers). Although progress is slow, the Association is moving forward in developing a strategy to make contact with individuals that can open doors to have Saint Augustine's University included in conversations with wealthy philanthropist, foundations and corporations that are considering giving to HBCUs.

Alumni whose organizations are engaged in philanthropy giving are asked to share their contact information. A marketing plan is being finalized that will

be utilized in explaining to prospective large donors the benefits of donating to SAU.

We hope to garner interest and participation of other stakeholders and look forward to working with our alma mater. The local community has shown significant interest in assisting SAU in developmental projects in and around the campus, such as the Saint Agnes hospital renovation, which could be quite a theme for raising significant revenues for the school, enhancing educational options for our students and enhancing the university's bond with the community.

Recruitment

Recruitment is even more challenging considering Covid-19, but Alumni Chapters are still participating in recruitment activities this year, either virtually at college fairs, high schools, or county sponsored events. Saint Augustine's University Alumni have contacts in numerous school systems, all along the East coast, as alumni serving as high school principals, counselors, teachers, or through high school alumni associations.

The NAA-SAU is encouraging Chapters to reach out to these individuals and let students in those high schools know about opportunities at Saint Augustine's University. We need to have a strategy for recruitment in the Covid-19 environment that keeps Saint Augustine's competitive in the recruitment of those students, who would traditionally consider matriculating at our alma mater.

It is very important that alumni work harder to be advocates and promoters for Saint Augustine's, especially in light of the fact that the pool of students going to universities/colleges is getting smaller and the competition for our students has gotten very competitive. The good thing is that more students of color have through *Black Lives Matter* and *Social Justice Initiatives* become more aware of the value of HBCUs and other minority serving institutions, and has

peaked an interest among the current generation in attending universities, like Saint Augustine's University.

The NAA-SAU participates in the UNCF National Alumni Council and their efforts to raise awareness about HBCUs. We also support SAU student participation in the UNCF Pre-Alumni Counsel. The NAA-SAU will continue to support the University's recruitment activities
