## NAA-SAU Summer Conference and Workshops

Saint Augustine's University (SAU) has completed academic year 2021-2022 and is beginning a new academic year with students arriving in August. Last year was President Dr. Christine McPhail first year and her administration has been able to increase enrollment, improve retention and make significant improvements to the appearance of the campus infrastructure. SAU Alumni Giving has improved, and the University was able to garner some significant grants for the Saint Agnes Hospital building and the University Chapel. In addition to these improvements, there were other noteworthy initiatives started at the school.

The 2022-2023 Academic Year will provide the University Team with an opportunity to continue its trend of working to maintain the enrollment increases and retention and, have the necessary resources to support improvements to the infrastructure, enhance a curricula that will bolster our ability to prepare students to become successful professionals and, position the university at a higher level of importance over the next decade.

During the *NAA-SAU Summer Conference and Workshops* we had several presentations from the SAU Administration on the University's Strategic Plan, Recruitment activities, and various initiatives for improving the future of St. Augustine's University, including the completion of requisite audits for SACS. ## **Mentoring Program**

The SAU Mentoring Program with the support of the NAA-SAU had a kick -off meeting in late January 2022, with approximately twentyfive alumni signing up to become Mentors., However, progress was stalled because of administrative challenges (e.g., background clearances, mentee assignments) and not everyone was assigned a Mentee. These administrative issues are being reconciled and some Mentor and Mentees are starting to interact as they should under the guidelines for the program and hopefully with continue into the summer and next academic year to grow the program. One of the objectives of the Mentor Program is to help in the retention of Saint Augustine's students through long term student-mentor partnerships. We will continue to accept applications from alumni to become mentors and work with the University's Leadership to have a successful Mentoring Program. #### Recruitment

Recruitment efforts have improved significantly. Dr. McPhail expects to increase enrollment to two thousand students over the next two - three years. The NAA-SAU has been asked to help in this goal, not only in our normal recruitment activities, but by making a special effort to reach out to the students who have been accepted to attend Saint Augustine's but may be still undecided. Chapters have started reaching out to the students, but we need many more alumni to help. If you are aware of any student considering attending Saint. Augustine's University, make a special effort to reach out to them and talk about your alma mater or have them reach out to other alum, who might be able to provide more information. Contact H. ## Advocacy and Fundraising

How can we help our Alma Mater?

There are several factors—(1) the University's Warning status with SACS, (2) developing new and increased revenue streams for the school, and (3) competing against other publicly funded HBCUs (some of whom have reduced their tuition to \$500. per semester) that will influence the University's ability to maintain a sustainability environment of providing quality education. With money from the CARES Act, the SAU Administration was able to reduce some of the University's debt (i.e., pay off mortgage on Falkcrest dormitory), help with retention and enrollment. However, these funds are no longer available. Given this, we as alumni must find alternatives to support our alma mater.

With the increase in giving last year, the SAU alumni level of participation is low, as monitored by organizations like the UNCF, noted to be around ten percent, not measured by what we donate, but by how many of us donate annually.

So how can we help? If each of us who participates in giving can get one other alumnus that you know to make a small donation, we can double our alumni participation rate, which is significate in soliciting corporate giving. (Many of the UNCF schools are raising their alumni participation rate and we can also.)

As we stated in last quarter's newsletter, let's set a goal of **Alumni Giving at One Million Dollars for Fiscal Year 2022-2023**. If we can get all our fellow Falcons to give something this year, whether it is \$50 or \$5,000, we easily reach this goal. The SAU Administration has asked alumni to support the implementation of some 'Smart Classrooms', "Gap Scholarships" to worthy students, who may need limited financial help to stay in school, and Scholarship monies for the Honors Program for especially talented or gifted students to attend St. Augustine's University. (https://www.st-aug.edu/academics/school-general-studies/honors-college/) Alumni can also adopt a local student in your area and support that student through your local NAA Chapter or individually.




## **Philadelphia**
